Dell claims to offer the "world's first wireless charging 2-in-1" mobile device-- the Latitude 7285, a 12-inch portable PC promising to be thin and light while meeting the needs of commercial clients.



First seen back at CES 2017, the Latitude 7285 is also described as the "world's thinnest Windows-based commercial 2-in-1." For the record, it is 7.25mm thick, 274.8mm wide and 209.2mm, while weight totals 0.68kg. It carries a 12.3-inch 2880 x 1920 resolution display with an anti-glare panel, and can be configured with a variety of processors, from Intel Core i5-7Y54 to Core i7-7Y75 (all 4.5W solutions), and M.2 PCIe NVMe storage from 128GB to 256GB.

The aforementioned wireless charging uses the WiTricity standard and requires extra hardware-- specifically either an included USB-C 45W adapter or an optional wireless charging mat (PM30W171). Use of the charging mat requires an optional Dell Latitude wireless charging keyboard.

Also included are an IR camera (Windows Hello compatible) and microphone embedded in the display bezel, stereo speakers and subwoofer with Waves Maxx/Audio Pro audio processing, x2 USB-C Thunderbolt 3 ports, x1 USIM card slot (WWAN only), x1 USB 3.0 memory card reader and a lock slot.

Dell is currently taking orders for the Latitude 7285. A 13-inch version (Latitude 7389) should hit the market on August 2017.
